CAMPFIRE CONCEPT: God demands complete obedience.

Below are some suggested ideas for your family to do together, and space for you to write down how you are leading your children to know God more. Check off which activities you led your child in.

Family Activity: In 1 Samuel 15, we learn the consequences of not obeying God completely. Saul received instructions from God to destroy the Amalekites and everything that belonged to them. He only partly obeyed God by keeping the best things for himself. Read verses 24-26 to your child, and ask your child how God responded to Saul's actions. Saul confessed his sin and asked forgiveness, but there were still consequences. God rejected Saul as King. Read Deuteronomy 13:4 and Ephesians 6:1, and discuss with your child that God demands complete obedience from us. Ask your child how this applies in his or her life.

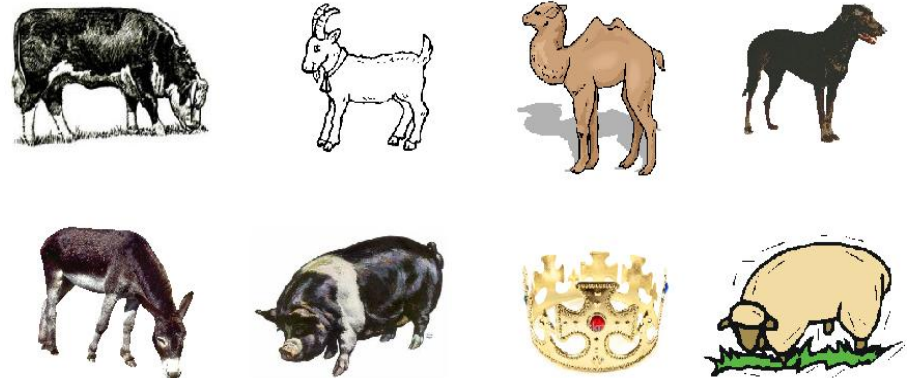
CAMPFIRE CONCEPT: God demands complete obedience.

Saul chose to only obey part of God's commands and doing what he wanted.
